Dear Sigma Pi Brothers and Friends:

Sigma Pi's new headquarters (pictured on the cover of this Annual Report) officially opens next month in a historic home called the Mitchell House in Lebanon, Tennessee—a suburb of Nashville. Built in 1906, the Mitchell House first saw life as a private residence followed by years as a boys' school. However by the 1980s, it was abandoned and fell into disrepair. Soon, like so many other grand homes of the bygone era, it seemed doomed to the wrecking ball. But in 1997, a businessman with roots in Lebanon sought to restore the house to its original grandeur. And within a few years, it found new life as the headquarters of a major national corporation and a spot on the National Register of Historic Places. Now it begins a new chapter as the home of Sigma Pi.

But how has the Mitchell House survived over 100 years and decades of neglect to become a renovation success story, one of the finest historic homes in all of Tennessee, and headquarters of the premier college fraternity? The answer: it was built upon a *strong foundation*.

Like the Mitchell House or anything else of enduring value, success can only be built upon a strong foundation. But rather than bricks

and mortar, successful lives are built upon a foundation of good values. And for thousands of young men, the Sigma Pi experience helps instill those foundational values like hard work, loyalty, integrity, cooperation, and charity. It is therefore no accident your support of the Educational *Foundation* makes the Sigma Pi *foundation* possible.

Executive Director Michael Ayalon (EO, SUNY Buffalo '97), Grand Sage Ed Levesque (HH, Bridgewater State, '89), and I invite you to join us for the formal opening and dedication of the new headquarters at the Mitchell House on March 29. The Impact of Your Gift

Each year, the Sigma Pi Educational Foundation provides nearly \$100,000 in support of the educational pursuits of the Sigma Pi Fraternity and its members. Such support would not be possible without the generosity of alumni and friends like you. Here are just a few of the programs your support made possible in 2013:

Scholarships

Traditional scholarships remain a core of the Foundation's activities. In 2013, the Foundation awarded 71 scholarships to individuals totaling over \$50,000. These ranged from scholarships awarded to brand new initiates for their outstanding scholastic achievement during their associate ("pledge") membership period to fellowships given to alumni brothers working on advanced graduate and professional degrees.

Mid-Year Leadership Conference:

The Foundation provided grant funding to support the Fraternity's Mid-Year Leadership Conference ("MYLC"). Held every February in Saint Louis, Missouri (strategically centered to facilitate travel by men from across the US and Canada), the weekend-long event provides training to each chapter's newly elected officers. Attendees receive training in foundational skills like strategic planning, goal setting, and leadership which help build success for both our chapters and young men. In 2013, MYLC was attended by 565 men, one of the largest gatherings of Sigma Pi men in the Fraternity's 116-year history.



Grants

The Foundation also awarded nearly a dozen grants to support or allow individuals to attend national and regional educational conferences and workshops, including the Undergraduate Interfraternity Institute, a five-day conference of the North American Interfraternity Conference that brings together fraternity men and sorority women from across the continent to create opportunities to explore, define, and enhance their leadership skills, personal awareness, commitment to their fraternity or sorority, and grow to expect values based action from themselves and those they lead.



Chapter Improvements

From Chapter Educational Funds ("CEFs") established by the alumni of individual chapters, the Foundation funded grants for educational improvements to chapter houses. For example, with the migration of course materials and even projects to online forums, the chapter at the University of Georgia found its aging WIFI network inadequate. The Foundation provided a grant from that chapter's CEF allowing for a complete replacement of its existing network with a modern system capable of handling a substantial higher volume of data traffic.

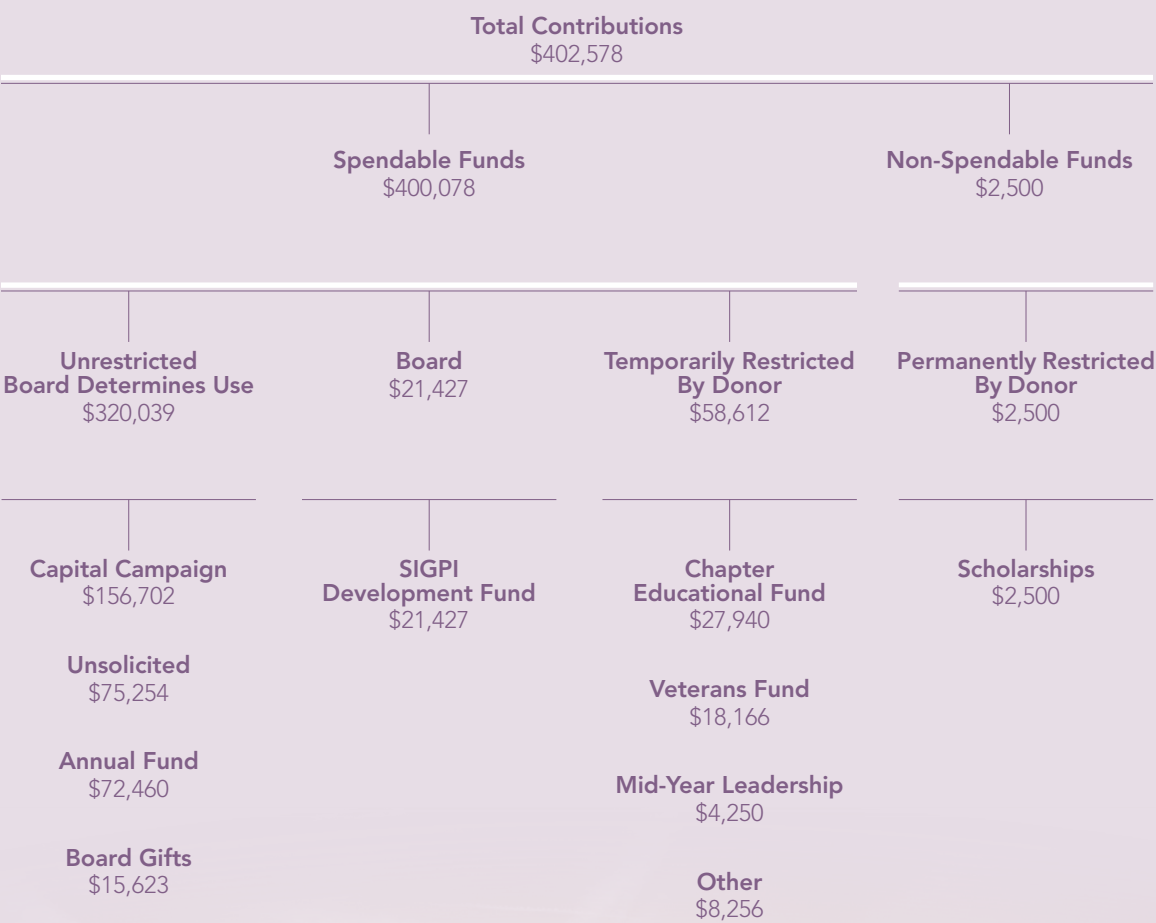

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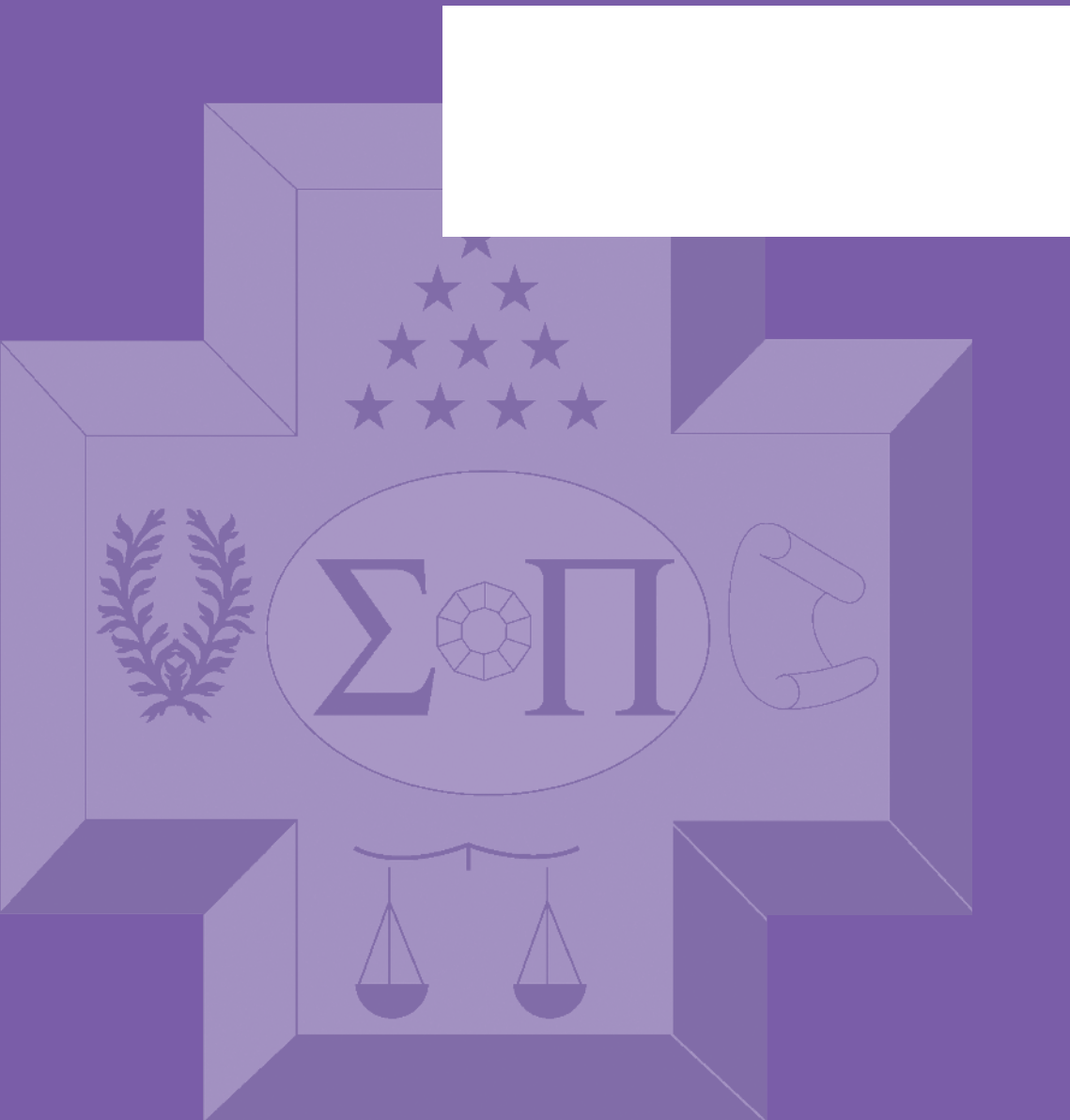
