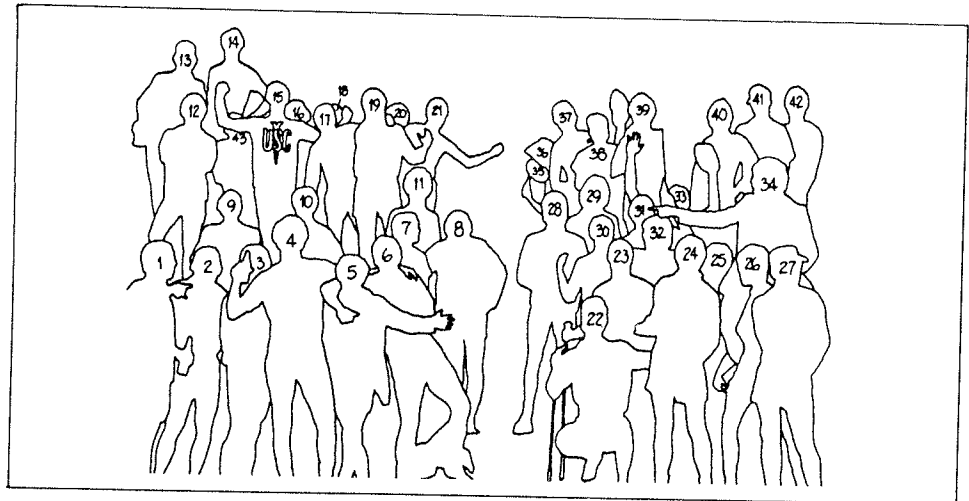


Dear Mom,

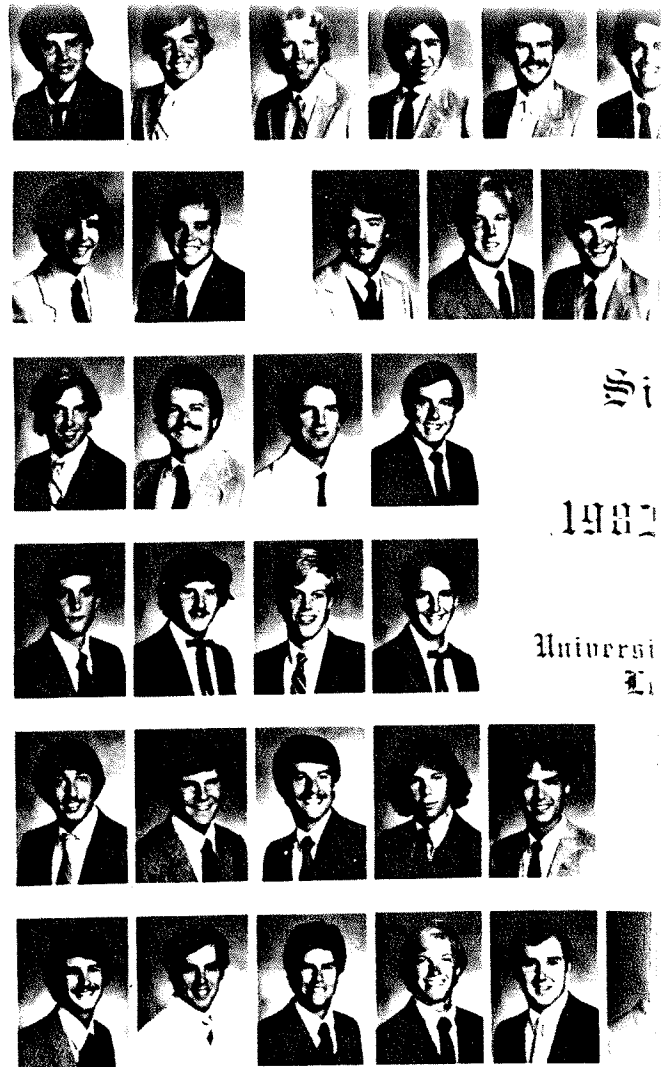

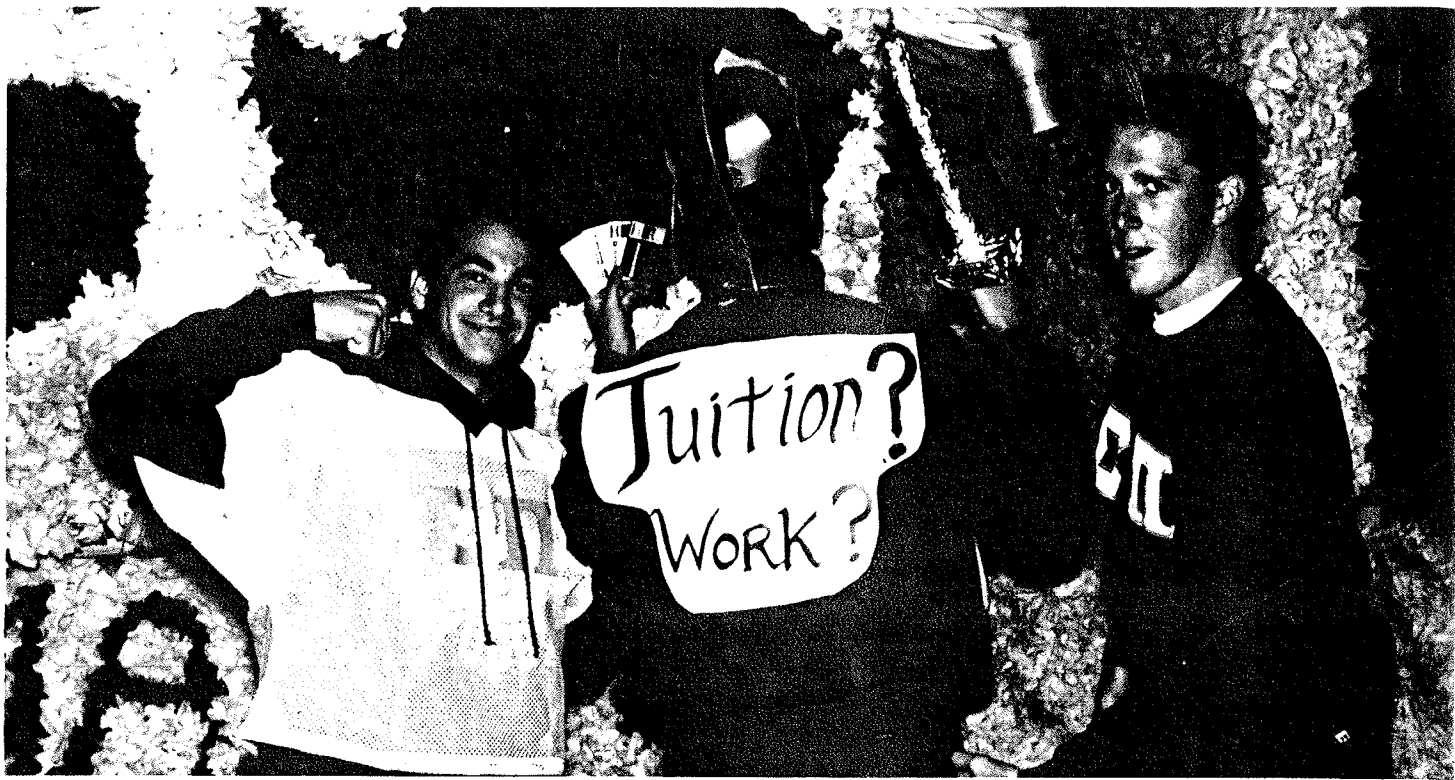
